

Herstat® 3% Propolis ACF® Ointment

1. What is Herstat?

Herstat is an ointment containing a patented, purified propolis extract collected by honey bees from a special variety of poplar trees, found in Canada.

Herstat is a natural product, manufactured in the EU to the highest pharmaceutical standards, and extensively tested in controlled clinical trials that confirm the product's effectiveness.

2. What is Herstat for?

Herstat is for the symptomatic treatment of skin lesions due to Herpes Simplex virus 1, also known as herpes labialis or cold sores.

Herstat can relieve the symptoms of cold sores, including itching, burning and pain, and can shorten the healing time.

3. How should Herstat be used?

For best results, apply Herstat at the first sign of symptoms, every hour for six applications, then continue to apply regularly, 5 times a day, until the attack disappears.

Always wash your hands after touching the sore to avoid spreading the infection. Propolis can cause skin irritation, so test before use.

The product should not be used in or around the eyes.

4. What side effects can Herstat cause?

An allergic reaction (contact dermatitis) to propolis may occur. Very rarely a temporary increase of local pain or swelling may be experienced after the application.

5. When should Herstat not be used?

Herstat should not be used in case of known hypersensitivity to propolis or to any of the other substances contained in the ointment (see point 7, Further Information).

You should not use Herstat if you are pregnant or breastfeeding. If irritation or rash occurs, you should stop the treatment. If problem persists, consult your doctor.

6. How should Herstat be stored?

Herstat should be stored below 25°C.

It should be used before the expiry date that is printed on the box and tube. Herstat should be kept out of the reach and sight of children

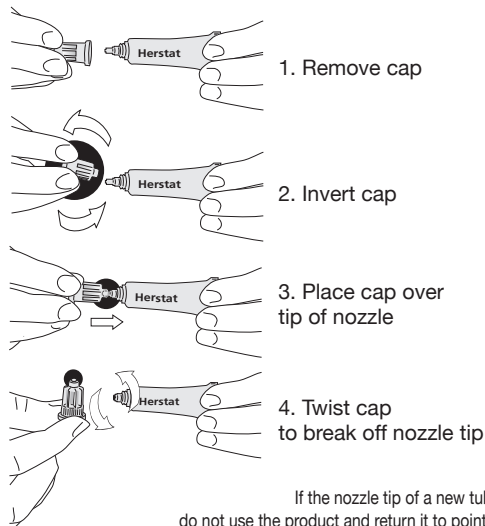
Propolis ACF.....30mg, and also:
