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1. What Liblab® cough suppository is and what it is used for

Liblab® is a herbal Cough medicine, containing dried ivy leaf extract as active ingredient.

Liblab® liquefies mucus, relaxes convulsive cough and calms coughing. In this way, **Liblab®** combats the typical complaints of bronchitis: increased formation of viscous mucus, shortness of breath and irritation of the throat. Troublesome and painful coughing is calmed, but not blocked, which is important for being able to cough up the mucus and thereby allow for trouble-free deep breathing.

Liblab® cough suppositories are indicated for acute catarrh of the respiratory tract accompanied by coughing; symptomatic treatment of chronic inflammatory bronchial diseases.

2. Before you take Liblab® cough suppositories

Do not take Liblab® cough suppositories

If you are hypersensitive (allergic) to the active substances or any of the other ingredients of **Liblab®**.

Children under 2 years of age because of the general risk of aggravation of respiratory symptoms through secretolytic drugs.

Taking other medicines, herbal or dietary supplements

Adverse effects have not been known with the use of **Liblab®** cough suppositories and other medicines. This preparation can therefore be combined safely with other medicines, such as antibiotics for example.

3. How to take Liblab® cough suppositories

Always take **Liblab®** cough suppositories exactly as your doctor or pharmacist has told you. You should check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure.

Unless otherwise prescribed: small children (2 – 5 years) insert 1 suppository 2 times daily, school children (6 – 9 years) and adolescents (>10 years) insert 1 suppository 3 times daily and adults insert 1 suppository 3 times daily.

Duration of use: If the symptoms persist longer than one week during the use of the medicinal product, a doctor or a pharmacist should be consulted.

If you have any further questions on the use of this product, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

4. Possible side effects

Like all medicines, **Liblab®** can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

In rare cases, **Liblab®** cough suppositories may cause some rash around the anal aperture in patients with a special sensitivity. If any of the side effects gets serious, or if you notice any side effects not listed in this leaflet, please tell your doctor or pharmacist.

5. How to store Liblab® cough suppositories

Keep medication out of reach of children.

Do not store above 30°C.

Do not use **Liblab®** cough suppositories after the expiry date which is stated on the outer carton.

What Liblab® cough suppository contains

Liblab® cough suppository contains 80mg dried ivy extract. It also contains silicon dioxide and hard fat.

What Liblab® cough suppositories look like and contents of the pack

Liblab® cough suppositories are brown torpedo shape suppositories.

Liblab® cough suppositories are available in packs of 10 suppositories.
