

Composition

Each ampoule contains: cyanocobalamin 1000 mcg, thiamine hydrochloride 250 mg, pyridoxine hydrochloride 100 mg, benzyl alcohol 0,090 ml, excipients q.s. ad 3 ml.

Each tablet contains: cyanocobalamin 1000 mcg, thiamine mononitrate 200 mg, pyridoxine hydrochloride 100 mg, excipients q.s.

Properties

This association has a pronounced analgesic effect on all neuralgias of whatever etiology. The therapeutic action of the Trilagavit association exceeds substantially the total effect of the three vitamins administered separately. This synergism makes the product very useful particularly for the treatment of acute cases or when a prompt reaction is required.

Indications

Neuralgias of any etiology, neuritis, polyneuritis, ischialgia.

Dosage

In acute cases, it is advisable to administer one ampoule daily or every two days, or a tablet three times daily.

In less serious cases, two to three ampoules weekly or one to two tablets daily.

Warning

Trilagavit should be injected intramuscularly only.

Injection of any product containing thiamine (vitamin B₁) must be made whilst the patient is lying down and by a qualified person; great care must be taken not to pierce a vein.

Repeated injections of preparations containing vit. B₁ may lead, in rare cases, to an anaphylactic shock which shall be treated with glucocorticoids, antihistaminics, etc.

Packing

Box of 3 and 100 ampoules.

15, 20, 100, 500 and 1000 tablets.
