Description

GenTeal is a preservative-free, aqueous solution containing hydroxypropylmethylcellulose 0.3%, sodium chloride, boric acid, potassium chloride and sodium perborate.

Intended use and indications

For the temporary relief of discomfort due to minor irritations of the eye from exposure to wind, sun, or other irritants. For use as a protectant against further irritation or to relieve dryness of the eye.

Direction for use

- Wash your hands
- Place one or two drops in each eye (avoid touching eye with dropper tip) and blink several time
- Apply a few drops to each lensbefore insertion.

Contraindications

Do not use if you are allergic to any of the ingredients.

Precautions

Discard any remaining solution 1 month after first opening.

Do not use after expiry date. Consult your eye care professional before changing solutions and before using any eye medication with contact lenses.

Close bottle after use.

Storage condition:

See folding box. Never touch the dropper tip of the bottle to any surface including the eye, since this may contaminate the solution.

Warnings

Keep out of the reach of children. If you experience persistent discomfort or irritation remove your lenses, stop using the product and consult your eye care professional.

Adverse Reactions

GenTeal is very well tolerated by users but there have been some reports of burning and stinging, allergic reactions and red eyes after instillation.

If you notice any of these, discontinue use and consult your eye care professional.
