DESCRIPTION *Betasone -N*, brand of betamethasone valerate/neomycin sulfate, is a combination of a corticosteroid and an antibacterial product.

ACTIONS The corticosteroid, betamethasone valerate, is effective in suppressing the inflammatory process. Neomycin, the anti-infective component in the combination, is included to provide action against susceptible grampositive and gram-negative microorganisms, commonly associated with skin infections, including many strains of Proteus vulgaris and S. aureus but not Streptococci.

INDICATIONS Betasone -N $\,$ is indicated for the topical treatment of steroid-responsive dermatoses where secondary bacterial infection is present or suspected.

CONTRAINDICATIONS Skin infections caused by herpes simplex, chickenpox, candida. Also hypersensitivity to any of the components.

PRECAUTIONS Avoid contact with eyes. If irritation develops discontinue use immediately. Long-term continuous topical use may lead to atrophic changes especially in the face.

Pregnancy: Pregnancy category C: There are no adequate and well controlled studies of the teratogenic effects of topically applied corticosteroids in pregnant women. Therefore, topical corticosteroids should be used during pregnancy only if the potential benefit justifies the potential risk to the fetus. Drugs of this class should not be used extensively on pregnant patients, in large amounts, or for prolonged periods of time.

Nursing Mothers: It is not known whether topical administration of corticosteroids can result in sufficient systemic absorption to produce detectable quantities in breast milk. Nevertheless, a decision should be made whether to discontinue nursing or to discontinue the drug, taking into account the importance of the drug to the mother.

Pediatric Use: Use in children under 12 years is not recommended.

ADVERSE REACTIONS Burning, itching, irritation, acneiform eruptions, skin atrophy and allergic contact dermatitis have been occasionally reported.

DOSAGE & ADMINISTRATION Apply a small quantity to affected area 2-3 times daily.
