- 1. What NormiGore is and what is it used for NormiGore longs to a group of medicines called antiplatelet medicinal products. Platelets are very small structures in the blood, smaller than red or white blood cells, which dump together during blood clotting. By preventing this clumping, antiplatelet medicinal products reduce the chances of blood clots forming (a process called thrombosis). NormiGore is taken to prevent blood clots formably forming in hardened blood vessels (arteries), a process known as atherothrombosis, which can lead to atherothrombotic events (such as stroke, heart attack, or death).

  You have been prescribed NormiGore to help prevent blood clots and reduce the risk of these severe events because:

   You have a condition of hardening of arteries (also known as atherosclerosis), and You have previenced a heart attack, stroke or have a condition known as peripheral arterial disease, or
   You have a condition of hardening of arteries (also known as unstable angina' or 'myocardial infarction' (heart attack). For the treatment of this condition your doctor may have placed a stent in the blocked or narrowed artery to restore effective blood flow. You should also be given acetylealicytic acid (a substance present in many medicines used to relieve pain and lower fever as well as to prevent blocd clotnip) by your doctor.

4. Possible side effects

Very rare side effects (affects less than 1 patient in 10,000); jaundice; severe abdominal pain with or without back pain; fever, breating difficulties sometimes associated with cough; generalized allergic reactions; swelling in the mouth; blisters of the skin; skin allergy; inflammation of the mouth (stomatilist); decrease in blood pressure; confusion; hallucinations; joint pain; muscular pain; taste disorders.

In addition, your doctor may identify changes in your blood or urine test results. If any of the side effects gets serious, or if you notice any side effects not listed in this leaflet, please tell your doctor or pharmacist.

## 5. How to store NormiGore

Keep all medicines out of reach of children.

Do not use **NormiGore** after the expiry date which is stated on the carton and on the blister.

Store below 30°C.
