4. Possible side effects
Like all medicines, Madronate can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them. Stop taking Madronate and contact a doctor immediately if you experience any of the following:

Sey inflammation, usually with pain, redness and light sensitivity.
Some necrosis of the jaw (osteonecrosis) associated with delayed healing and infection, often
Symptoms from esceptingus such as pain when you swallow, difficulties in swallowing, chest
pain or new or worsened hearthurn.
Unusual fracture of the thigh bone particularly in patients on long-term treatment for osteoporosis may occur rarely. Contact your doctor if you experience pain, weakness or discomfort in your thigh, bip or groin as this may be an early indication of a possible fracture of the thigh bone.
However in clinical studies the other sign defects that were observed were usually mild and did not cause the patients to stop taking their tablets.

Tablet core: lactose monohydrate, cellulose microcrystalline, crospoyidone, magnesium


